## **WEEK 76 – ANSWERS**

1. **Sunday** – Worship/Time With Family/Review Answers With Others

2. **Monday** –

1) Job 15 – Read & Answer Below

- a) As this chapter opens, what person is speaking? (Eliphaz the Temanite, vs. 1)
- b) Job 15:1 reads, “Then answered \_\_\_\_\_ the Temanite, and said.” (Eliphaz, vs. 1)
- c) In what verse does the confused Eliphaz accuse Job of casting off fear and restraining his prayer? (Job 15:4)
- d) Like the other “friends,” what verse finds Eliphaz saying to Job, “For thy mouth uttereth thine iniquity...?” (Job 15:5)
- e) In Job 15:13, Eliphaz (still accusing Job) says, “That thou turnest thy spirit against \_\_\_\_\_, and lettest such words go out of thy mouth?” (God)
- f) Showing the philosophy of Eliphaz, Job 15:20 reads, “The \_\_\_\_\_ man travaileth with \_\_\_\_\_ all his days....” (wicked; pain)
- g) Showing the ridiculous nature of Eliphaz’s position (i.e., the wicked never prosper—even on earth, suffering is a direct result of sin, etc.), Job 15:29 (from the perspective of Eliphaz) says that the wicked, “...shall not be \_\_\_\_\_, neither shall his substance continue, neither shall he prolong the perfection thereof upon the \_\_\_\_\_.” (rich; earth)
- h) What late verse in this chapter states, “They conceive mischief, and bring forth vanity, and their belly prepareth deceit?” (Job 15:35)

2) 2 Corinthians 2 – Read Only

3. **Tuesday** –

1) Job 16 – Read & Answer Below

- a) As this chapter opens, what person is speaking? (Job, vs. 1)
- b) Job 16:1 reads, “Then \_\_\_\_\_ answered and said....” (Job)
- c) Job 16:2 continues, “I have heard \_\_\_\_\_ such things: \_\_\_\_\_ comforters are ye all.” (many; miserable)
- d) Job 16:4 says, “I also could \_\_\_\_\_ as ye do: if your soul were in \_\_\_\_\_ soul’s stead, I could heap up \_\_\_\_\_ against you, and shake mine head at you.” (speak; my; words)
- e) Instead of railing on his friends, if they were in his (Job’s) position, in Job 16:5, Job says, “But I would \_\_\_\_\_ you with my \_\_\_\_\_, and the moving of my lips should assuage your grief.” (strengthen; mouth)
- f) Speaking of the vile treatment Job has received of his “friends,” what verse finds Job saying, “God hath delivered me to the ungodly, and turned me over into the hands of the wicked?” (Job 16:11)
- g) Job 16:16 vividly describes the drastic nature of Job’s condition. It reads, “My \_\_\_\_\_ is foul with \_\_\_\_\_, and on my eyelids is the shadow of \_\_\_\_\_.” (face; weeping; death)

- h) In what verse does Job says, "...also my prayer is pure?" (Job 16:17)
- i) In what verse does Job state, "My friends scorn me: but mine eye poureth out tears unto God?" (Job 16:20)

2) 2 Corinthians 2 – Read & Answer Below

- a) 2 Corinthians 2:1 reads, "But I determined this with myself, that I would \_\_\_\_\_ come again to you in \_\_\_\_\_." (not; heaviness)
- b) In what verse does Paul write, "For out of much affliction and anguish of heart I wrote unto you with many tears..."? (2 Corinthians 2:4)
- c) Referencing back to the withdrawal situation of 1 Corinthians 5, and pertaining to the brother's repentance, 2 Corinthians 2:6 states, "Sufficient to such a man is this \_\_\_\_\_, which was inflicted of \_\_\_\_\_." (punishment; many)
- d) In what verse did the inspired apostle Paul pen, "For to this end also did I write, that I might know the proof of you, whether ye be obedient in all things?" (2 Corinthians 2:9)
- e) 2 Corinthians 2:11 is a notable passage. It reads, "Lest \_\_\_\_\_ should get an advantage of us: for we are not \_\_\_\_\_ of his \_\_\_\_\_." (Satan; ignorant; devices)
- f) What verse mentions Paul preaching "Christ's gospel?" (2 Corinthians 2:12)
- g) What passage says, "For we are not as many which corrupt the word of God..."? (2 Corinthians 2:17)

4. Wednesday –

1) Job 17 – Read & Answer Below

- a) As this chapter opens, what person is still speaking? (Job)
- b) Due to his physical condition, Job even says that his "\_\_\_\_\_ is corrupt." (breath, vs. 1)
- c) In what early verse does Job inquire, "Are there not mockers with me...?" (Job 17:2)
- d) In what verse does Job utter, "...and the innocent shall stir up himself against the hypocrite?" (Job 17:8)
- e) Speaking to his three "friends," in Job 17:10, Job states, "...for I cannot find one \_\_\_\_\_ man \_\_\_\_\_ you." (wise; among)
- f) In figurative language, Job said, "I have said to \_\_\_\_\_, Thou art my father..." (corruption, vs. 14)
- g) In figurative language, Job said, "...to the \_\_\_\_\_, Thou art my mother, and my sister." (worm, vs. 14)

2) 2 Corinthians 2 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) According to 2 Corinthians 2:6 (remembering the background of 1 Corinthians 5), is church discipline/withdrawal of fellowship to be enacted by "a few" or "by the entire congregation?" (This passage clearly says "which was inflicted of many." It is tremendously sad when a godly eldership does what is right in withdrawing from a brother or sister in sin and then finds a congregation that ignores such withdrawal only to continue to fellowship the erring one. Such rebellious members of the church should themselves be withdrawn from (1 Thes. 5:14, 2 Thes. 3:6))
- b) Please read 2 Corinthians 2:6-8. When a withdrawn from brother repents, what should the congregation do in regard to the penitent brother? (They

should forgive him and accept him back with loving arms. After all, this was the whole point of the withdrawing/discipline—it was to bring him back to God!)

- c) In what verse does Paul say, “Wherefore I beseech you that ye would confirm your love toward him?” (2 Corinthians 2:8)
- d) What verse references the phrase, “...whether ye be obedient in all things?” (2 Corinthians 2:9)
- e) What passage in this chapter references Satan as a real entity with real devices? (2 Corinthians 2:11)
- f) What verse in this chapter makes reference to “Titus my brother?” (2 Corinthians 2:13)
- g) 2 Corinthians 2:14 reads, “Now \_\_\_\_\_ be unto God, which always causeth us to \_\_\_\_\_ in \_\_\_\_\_.” (thanks; triumph; Christ)
- h) What verse ends with, “...and maketh manifest the savour of His knowledge by us in every place?” (2 Corinthians 2:14)
- i) According to 2 Corinthians 2:17 is it possible to “corrupt the word of God?” (Yes. Not only is it possible, but the passage says that “many” do it—that is, they “corrupt the word of God.” Cf., Matthew 7:13-15, 21-27)

#### 5. **Thursday** –

##### 1) Job 18 – Read & Answer Below

- a) What person begins his second speech at this chapter opens? (Bildad, vs. 1)
- b) Job 18:1 reads, “Then answered \_\_\_\_\_ the Shuhite, and said.” (Bildad)
- c) Again, still accusing Job of wickedness, in Job 18:5, Bildad says, “Yea, the light of the \_\_\_\_\_ shall be put out....” (wicked)
- d) In what verse does Bildad continue to persecute Job by saying, “...and the robber shall prevail against him?” (Job 18:9)
- e) What verse says, “His strength shall be hunger-bitten, and destruction shall be ready at his side?” (Job 18:12)
- f) In what passage does Bildad state, “...brimstone shall be scattered upon his habitation?” (Job 18:15)
- g) Job 18:17 reads, “His \_\_\_\_\_ shall perish from the earth, and he shall have no \_\_\_\_\_ in the street.” (remembrance; name)
- h) Still following the same premises (i.e., they thought Job was suffering because of his sin), in what verse does Bildad declare, “Surely such are the dwellings of the wicked, and this is the place of him that knoweth not God?” (Job 18:21)

##### 2) 2 Corinthians 3 – Read Only

#### 6. **Friday** –

##### 1) Job 19 – Read & Answer Below

- a) As this chapter opens what person responds to Bildad’s 2<sup>nd</sup> speech? (Job)
- b) Job 19:1 reads, “Then \_\_\_\_\_ answered and said.” (Job)
- c) Responding to Bildad, Job says (in Job 19:2), “How long will ye \_\_\_\_\_ my soul, and \_\_\_\_\_ me in pieces with \_\_\_\_\_?” (vex; break; words)
- d) Still not understanding that Satan was to blame for his afflictions, in Job 19:6, Job utters, “Know now that \_\_\_\_\_ hath overthrown me....” (God)
- e) In what verse does Job say, “...and mine hope hath He removed like a tree?” (Job 19:10)

- f) Job 19:14 reads, “My \_\_\_\_\_ have failed, and my familiar \_\_\_\_\_ have forgotten me.” (kinsfolk; friends)
- g) In what passage does Job declare, “All my inward friends abhorred me: and they whom I loved are turned against me?” (Job 19:19)
- h) Job 19:21 finds Job saying, “Have \_\_\_\_\_ upon me, have \_\_\_\_\_ upon me, O ye my friends; for the hand of \_\_\_\_\_ hath \_\_\_\_\_ me.” (pity; pity; God; touched)
- i) Job 19:25 says, “For I \_\_\_\_\_ that my \_\_\_\_\_ liveth....” (know; redeemer)
- j) In what late verse does Job say, “...that ye may know there is a judgment?” (Job 19:29)

2) 2 Corinthians 3 – Read & Answer Below

- a) To the Corinthian Christians, Paul says, “Ye are our \_\_\_\_\_ written in our \_\_\_\_\_, known and \_\_\_\_\_ of all men.” (epistle; hearts; read)
- b) The above referenced verse is found in what passage? (2 Corinthians 3:2)
- c) The end of what verse finds Paul penning, “...but our sufficiency is of God?” (2 Corinthians 3:5)
- d) 2 Corinthians 3:6 plainly reads, “Who also hath made us able ministers of the \_\_\_\_\_ testament....” (new)
- e) Referring to the cessation of the Old Law as opposed to the start and continuation of the New Testament, 2 Corinthians 3:11 says, “For if that which is done \_\_\_\_\_ was glorious, much more that which \_\_\_\_\_ is glorious.” (away; remaineth)
- f) What verse begins, “But their minds were blinded...?” (2 Corinthians 3:14)
- g) What verse declares, “But even unto this day, when Moses is read, the veil is upon their heart?” (2 Corinthians 3:15)
- h) What passage in this chapter reads, “But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord?” (2 Corinthians 3:18)

7. Saturday –

1) Job 20 – Read & Answer Below

- a) As this chapter opens, is Job speaking? (No)
- b) As this chapter opens, who begins their 2<sup>nd</sup> speech? (Zophar, vs. 1)
- c) Job 20:1 reads, “Then answered \_\_\_\_\_ the Naamathite, and said.” (Zophar)
- d) In what verse does Zophar tell Job “that the triumphing of the wicked is short, and the joy of the hypocrite but for a moment?” (Job 20:5)
- e) What verse says, “He hath swallowed down riches, and he shall vomit them up again...?” (Job 20:15)
- f) In Job 20:24, Zophar stresses, “He shall flee from the \_\_\_\_\_ weapon, and the \_\_\_\_\_ of steel shall \_\_\_\_\_ him through.” (iron; bow; strike)
- g) What late verse declares, “The heaven shall reveal his iniquity; and the earth shall rise up against him?” (Job 20:27)
- h) From the lips of Zophar (to the righteous—yet suffering Job), Job 20:29 states, “This is the portion of a \_\_\_\_\_ man from \_\_\_\_\_, and the heritage \_\_\_\_\_ unto him by \_\_\_\_\_.” (wicked; God; appointed; God)

2) 2 Corinthians 3 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) Comparing the Old Testament to the New Testament, what verse declares, "...not of the letter, but of the spirit: for the letter killeth, but the spirit giveth life?" (2 Corinthians 3:6)
- b) Speaking of the Old Testament (i.e., Law of Moses), 2 Corinthians 3:7 says, "...which glory was to be done \_\_\_\_\_." (away)
- c) What verse in this chapter says, "For if that which is done away was glorious, much more that which remaineth is glorious?" (2 Corinthians 3:11)
- d) 2 Corinthians 3:13 teaches us, "And not as \_\_\_\_\_, which put a veil over his face, that the children of Israel could not steadfastly look to the end of that which is \_\_\_\_\_." (Moses; abolished)
- e) Read 2 Corinthians 3:14. Is it possible for one's mind to be "blinded?" (Yes!)
- f) The end of 2 Corinthians 3:14 says, "...which veil is done \_\_\_\_\_ in Christ." (away)
- g) 2 Corinthians 3:15 shows that reading the Scriptures does not prevent spiritual blindness. It reads, "But even unto this day, when Moses is \_\_\_\_\_, the \_\_\_\_\_ is upon their \_\_\_\_\_." (read; veil; heart)
- h) Does merely reading the Scriptures make one right with God? (Not at all. Compare vs. 14-15. Also see Acts 13:27 and Acts 15:21. Reading is critical (1 Timothy 4:13), but the reading must include the correct interpretation (2 Timothy 2:15))
- i) Does this chapter clearly teach that the Old Law has been abolished/done away with, and that we are under the New Testament? (Yes! To read the chapter is to answer the question. Compare vs. 6-7, 11, 13-14)
