 - a) Was Paul an apostle? (Yes, vs. 1)
 - b) Was Jesus Christ raised from the dead? (Yes, vs. 1)
 - c) According to Galatians 1:2, this letter was written “unto the _____ of Galatia.” (churches)
 - d) According to Galatians 1:4, Jesus “gave Himself for our _____.” (sins)

- e) Per Galatians 1:6-9, how many legitimate/correct gospels exist? (Only one gospel. This section is extremely clear. Cf., Ephesians 4:4-6, etc.)
- f) Referencing his preaching, what verse finds Paul saying, "...for if I yet pleased men, I should not be the servant of Christ?" (Galatians 1:10)
- g) In what verse does Paul mention his former religion (i.e., "the Jews' religion") including the fact that he had even "persecuted the church of God, and wasted it?" (Galatians 1:13)
- h) In what verse does Paul speak of some who "were apostles before me?" (Galatians 1:17)
- i) In Galatians 1:23 the inspired apostle Paul explains, "But they had heard only, That he which _____ us in times past now _____ the faith which once he destroyed." (persecuted; preacheth)

- a) This psalm opens, "In the _____ put I my trust...." (Lord, vs. 1)
- b) What great verse reads, "If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?" (Psalm 11:3)
- c) According to this psalm, "the Lord's throne" is located where? (In heaven, vs. 4)
- d) Psalm 11:5 begins, "The Lord trieth the _____...." (righteous)
- e) The phrase "their cup," is found in what verse of this chapter? (Psalm 11:6)
- f) Psalm 11:7 begins, "For the _____ Lord loveth _____...." (righteous; righteousness)

2) Galatians 1 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) According to the first part of this chapter was Paul "an apostle" through self-creation? In other words, was his apostleship one of his own doing? (No, not at all. As Galatians 1:1 shows, he was made an apostle according to the will of God)
- b) In what verse does Paul refer to the world as "this present evil world?" (Galatians 1:4)
- c) Galatians 1:8 reads, "But though _____, or an _____ from heaven, preach any other _____ unto you that that which we have preached unto you, let him be _____." (we; angel; gospel; accursed)
- d) Galatians 1:9 continues, "As we said before, so say I now again, if any _____ preach any other _____ unto you than that ye have _____, let him be _____." (man; gospel; received; accursed)
- e) After reading Galatians 1:8-9, (which includes condemnation upon even a new gospel from an angel) is it acceptable to embrace "other" gospels from Mormons, *et cetera*? (No! This chapter clearly and forever says there is ONLY ONE GOSPEL and any other is to be considered a fake!)
- f) In Galatians 1:11-12 Paul makes it forever clear that his preaching/writing was based on revelation from Deity and not from any man. In this text he states, "But I certify you, brethren, that the _____ which was _____ of me is not after man. For I neither received it of man, neither was I _____ it, but _____ the _____ of _____ Christ." (gospel; preached; taught; by; revelation; Jesus)
- g) Galatians 1:13 refers to Paul's former "conversation in time past." What does this mean? (Conversation in the King James means, "lifestyle or manner of

living.” Note – As with Paul, people know about our “lifestyle.” Thankfully, as this text shows, people can change. Paul went from persecutor to preacher!

- h) According to Galatians 1:13-14 may a person be religious and yet religiously wrong? (Absolutely. In fact, most people are religious and religiously wrong. Compare, Matthew 7:13-15, 21. See also, Acts 8:26ff)
- i) What other apostle did Paul stay with for “fifteen days”? Did he stay with this apostle immediately after his conversion? (Peter; No)
- j) What verse says of Paul, “And was unknown by face unto the churches of Judaea which were in Christ?” (Galatians 1:22)

- c) What verse reads, “Consider and hear me, O Lord my God: lighten mine eyes, lest I sleep the sleep of death?” (Psalm 13:3)
- d) What verse implies that the wicked/evil “rejoice” when the righteous are troubled and moved from God? (Psalm 13:4)
- e) In what verse does the psalmist confess to God, “But I have trusted in Thy mercy...?” (Psalm 13:5)
- f) In what verse does the psalmist say (to God), “...my heart shall rejoice in Thy salvation?” (Psalm 13:5)
- g) Based on God’s bountiful blessings the psalmist feels compelled to pray, sing or study? (To sing, vs. 6)

- d) What verse makes reference to “the right hands of fellowship?” ([Galatians 2:9](#))
- e) Galatians 2:11 finds Paul saying, “But when _____ was come to Antioch, I _____ him to the face, because he was to be _____.” ([Peter; withstood; blamed](#))
- f) The phrase, “But when I saw that they walked not uprightly according to the truth of the gospel...,” is found in what verse? ([Galatians 2:14](#))
- g) Galatians 2:20 reads, “I am _____ with Christ: nevertheless I _____; yet _____ I, but _____ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the _____ of the Son of God, who _____ me, and gave Himself for me.” ([crucified; live; not; Christ; faith; loved](#))

- b) What verse reads, “The Lord looked down from heaven upon the children of men...?” ([Psalm 14:2](#))
- c) Psalm 14:3 describes the wicked thusly, “They are all _____ aside, they are all together become _____: there is none that doeth good, no, not one.” ([gone; filthy](#))
- d) The phrase “my people” (referring in context to God’s people) is found in what verse? ([Psalm 14:4](#))
- e) What verse contains the words, “...for God is in the generation of the righteous?” ([Psalm 14:5](#))
- f) The Lord is said to be the refuge for what group? ([The poor, vs. 6](#))
- g) The phrase “...Jacob shall rejoice, and Israel shall be glad” is found in what verse? ([Psalm 14:7](#))

2) Galatians 2 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) What two faithful brethren did Paul mention as going with him “again to Jerusalem?” ([Barnabas and Titus, vs. 1](#))
- b) Was Paul’s ministry primarily to the Gentiles or to the Jews? ([It was to the Gentiles, vs. 2, 7-8](#))
- c) Was Titus (a Greek) “compelled to be circumcised?” ([No, vs. 3](#))
- d) What verse in this chapter speaks of “false brethren?” ([Galatians 2:4](#))
- e) Galatians 2:5 reads, “To whom we gave place by subjection, no, not for an _____; that the _____ of the gospel might _____ with you.” ([hour; truth; continue](#))
- f) In what verse did Paul say, “...for they who seemed to be somewhat in conference added nothing to me?” ([Galatians 2:6](#))
- g) List the three “pillars” in the Jerusalem church, as named by Paul. ([James, Cephas \(i.e., Peter\) and John, vs. 9](#))
- h) What does the Bible mean (in Galatians 2:9) when it speaks about “the right hands of fellowship” being given? ([It is referring to the nature of fellowship. In context it is speaking about how Peter, James and John extended or recognized the fellowship that existed between them and Paul/Barnabas because that all parties were in fellowship with God. As 1 John 1:3-7 makes clear, those in fellowship with God are in fellowship with each other.](#))

Fellowship with others is only allowable when such persons are FIRST in fellowship with God!

- i) Is it important to remember/care for the poor? (Yes, vs. 10)
- j) Did the apostle Paul confront/rebuke another apostle for being a hypocrite? (Yes. Paul confronted/corrected Peter, vs. 11ff. Note – Later when Peter wrote 2 Peter 3:15 he (Peter) referred to Paul as his “beloved brother Paul” thus showing that he had humbly submitted to such correction (by Paul) and made himself right with God. This passage in Galatians 2 shows the need to correct error, but it also shows an example of one who properly took the rebuke/correction.)
- k) As listed in Galatians 2:13, what does “dissembled” and “dissimulation” refer to? (These terms are speaking of hypocrisy. Peter and (by his influence) others were shunning the Gentiles based on their fear of the Jews even though before they were eating with the Gentiles. They were being hypocrites.)
- l) Galatians 2:16 states, “Knowing that a man is not _____ by the works of the law, but by the _____ of Jesus Christ....” (justified; faith)
