

# THE BIBLE STUDY PROGRAM

## WEEK 84 – Psalm 21 – 26 & Galatians 5 – 6

**Overview** – This study is a 6 day program covering both the Old Testament (OT) and the New Testament (NT). This study program is to take place on a daily basis (Monday through Saturday). The study will involve reading/studying 6 OT chapters and 2 NT chapters per week. The OT chapters will only be covered 1 time with the NT chapters being covered 3 times. Depending on reading speed, chapter length, etc., total study time should take approximately 15 to 30 minutes a day. In other words, by simply dedicating **only** about 15 to 30 minutes a day (6 days a week) to Bible study, **in roughly 2 ½ to 3 years, you will have read and studied the entire Bible.** If followed, you will have read the OT once and the NT three times, while studying through the entire Bible. The KJV (King James Version) is used to prepare the questions.

**How it works** – Read, study, and/or answer questions as outlined below. Place an “x” in the blank after you have completed each day’s study. If you are unable to do the study on the set day, either try to “double up” and get back on schedule or if you get several days behind, simply skip to the current day’s schedule. If necessary you can always come back weeks or months later and study the chapters you missed. You will be able to identify any missed chapters easily if you consistently mark your studied chapters with an “x.” Practically speaking, however, this is not advisable and the student is encouraged to “stay on the daily schedule.” In short, this program will not work, if you do not commit yourself to a daily study habit. We also suggest that the student keeps the weekly study program sheets in a 3 ring binder for easy reference. It is likewise necessary that everyone in the local congregation who is involved in this study program get together weekly or at least biweekly to review the questions and answers.

1. **Sunday** – Worship/Time With Family/Review Answers With Others

2. **Monday** –

1) Psalm 21 – Read & Answer Below

- a) As this Psalm opens, does the psalmist discuss “the joy” of salvation or “the despair and trouble” connected with salvation?
- b) Per Psalm 21:2, did God listen to his prayer or reject his prayer?
- c) What verse says, “He asked life of Thee, and Thou gavest it him, even length of days...?”
- d) What verse begins, “For the king trusteth in the Lord...?”
- e) What verse says of God, “Thine hand shall find out all Thine enemies...?”
- f) Discussing God’s overthrow of the enemies, Psalm 21:9 tells us, “...the Lord shall swallow them up in His \_\_\_\_\_.”
- g) Talking about God, Psalm 21:13 ends this inspired chapter thusly, “...so will we \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ Thy power.”

2) Galatians 5 – Read Only

3. **Tuesday** –

1) Psalm 22 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Does Jesus quote Psalm 22:1 while He is on the Cross (See Matthew 27:46)?
- b) What verse says, “Our fathers trusted in Thee: they trusted, and Thou didst deliver them?”
- c) In opposition to Psalm 22:4-5, the first two words of Psalm 22:6 are, “\_\_\_\_\_”
- d) Does Psalm 22:6-8 involve Messianic prophecies concerning Christ on the Cross?
- e) In what verse does the prophetic psalmist cry, “Many bulls have compassed me...?”
- f) Picturing the suffering Christ on the cross, Psalm 22:15 reads, “My strength is dried up like a \_\_\_\_\_; and my \_\_\_\_\_ cleaveth to my jaws; and Thou has brought me into the dust of \_\_\_\_\_.”
- g) In what verse does the psalmist prophesy of Christ, “...they pierced My hands and My feet?”
- h) Again in prophetic fashion, Psalm 22:18 tells us, “They part my garments among them, and cast \_\_\_\_\_ upon my \_\_\_\_\_.”
- i) What verse reads, “I will declare Thy name unto My brethren: in the midst of the congregation will I praise Thee?”
- j) What verse in this chapter declares, “For the kingdom is the Lord’s: and He is the Governor among the nations?”

2) Galatians 5 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Remembering the background of this book (i.e., the false teachers trying to bind parts of the Law of Moses into Christianity), Galatians 5:1 reads, “Stand fast therefore in the \_\_\_\_\_ wherewith \_\_\_\_\_ hath made us free, and be not entangled \_\_\_\_\_ with the yoke of \_\_\_\_\_.”

- b) Does “circumcision” apparently have something to do with “what” certain ones were trying to bind upon the brethren at Galatia?
- c) According to the inspired apostle Paul and according to the words of Galatians 5:4, is it possible for a Christian to be involved in actions to the point that it might be said that he or she has “fallen from grace?”
- d) What verse contains the beautiful phrase, “...but faith which worketh by love?”
- e) In what verse does Paul pen, “I would they were even cut off which trouble you?”
- f) Galatians 5:15 declares, “But if ye \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ one another, take heed that ye be not \_\_\_\_\_ one of another.”
- g) What verse in this chapter begins, “Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these...?”
- h) What verse in this chapter begins, “But the fruit of the Spirit is...?”

4. **Wednesday** –

1) Psalm 23 – Read & Answer Below

- a) The psalmist declares that “The \_\_\_\_\_ is my shepherd.”
- b) The psalmist says that the Lord leads him beside “the \_\_\_\_\_ waters.”
- c) What famous verse in this famous chapter records, “Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil...?”
- d) Why does the psalmist not fear death?
- e) In what verse does the psalmist declare, “...my cup runneth over?”
- f) Does the inspired penman write, “...and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever? “

2) Galatians 5 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) For those who were trying to bind the necessity of circumcision as an element within Christianity, Paul stated (in Galatians 5:3), “For I testify again to every man that is \_\_\_\_\_, that he is a \_\_\_\_\_ to do the \_\_\_\_\_ law.”
- b) Galatians 5:4 reads, “Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; ye are \_\_\_\_\_ from \_\_\_\_\_.”
- c) Galatians 5:6 reads, “For \_\_\_\_\_ Christ Jesus neither \_\_\_\_\_ availeth any thing, nor \_\_\_\_\_; but \_\_\_\_\_ which worketh by \_\_\_\_\_.”
- d) In what verse does the inspired apostle declare, “A little leaven leaveneth the whole lump?”
- e) In what verse does Paul state, “...but he that troubleth you shall bear his judgment, whosoever he be?”
- f) In what verse does Paul say, “...but by love serve one another?”
- g) How many specific items are listed among the “works of the flesh” (not counting “and such like”)?
- h) Does the phrase “and such like” (vs. 21) imply that God expects people to be able to determine what “and such like” means?
- i) List the “fruit of the Spirit.”
- j) Read Galatians 5:25. What does it mean to “live in the Spirit/walk in the Spirit?”
- k) This chapter ends, “Let us not be desirous of vain glory, \_\_\_\_\_ one another, \_\_\_\_\_ one another.”

5. **Thursday** –

1) Psalm 24 – Read & Answer Below

- a) According to this chapter, “the earth” and the things thereof belong to man or God?
- b) What questions are given in Psalm 24:3?
- c) Per this chapter, is having “a pure heart” necessary to pleasing God?
- d) With the background of the Ark of the Covenant coming into Jerusalem (with a view toward the ascension of Christ coming into Glory after his time on earth), Psalm 24:7 reads, “Lift up your heads, O ye \_\_\_\_\_; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting \_\_\_\_\_; and the \_\_\_\_\_ of glory shall come in.”
- e) What question begins Psalm 24:8?
- f) What question begins Psalm 24:10?
- g) Psalm 24:10 clearly reveals “the King of glory,” when it says, “...The \_\_\_\_\_ of hosts, He is the King of glory. Selah.”

2) Galatians 6 – Read Only

6. **Friday** –

1) Psalm 25 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Psalm 25:1-2 declares, “Unto Thee, O \_\_\_\_\_, do I lift up my \_\_\_\_\_. O my \_\_\_\_\_, I \_\_\_\_\_ in Thee: let me not be \_\_\_\_\_, let not mine \_\_\_\_\_ triumph over me.”
- b) Psalm 25:4 finds the psalmist saying, “Shew me Thy \_\_\_\_\_, O Lord; \_\_\_\_\_ me Thy \_\_\_\_\_.”
- c) In what verse does the psalmist plead, “Remember not the sins of my youth...?”
- d) What verse states, “Good and upright is the Lord: therefore will He teach sinners in the way?”
- e) What verse teaches, “The secret of the Lord is with them that fear Him...?”
- f) In Psalm 25:18, the inspired writer pens, “Look upon mine affliction and my pain; and \_\_\_\_\_ all my \_\_\_\_\_.”
- g) Psalm 25:20 reads, “O keep my \_\_\_\_\_, and \_\_\_\_\_ me...”
- h) How many times is the term “ashamed” mentioned in this chapter?

2) Galatians 6 – Read & Answer Below

- a) What is the first word of this chapter?
- b) Galatians 6:1 declares, “Brethren, if a man be \_\_\_\_\_ in a fault, ye which are \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_ such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering \_\_\_\_\_, lest thou also be tempted.”
- c) Galatians 6:2 teaches us, “Bear ye one another’s \_\_\_\_\_, and so fulfill the \_\_\_\_\_ of Christ.”
- d) Galatians 6:5 likewise teaches, “For every man shall \_\_\_\_\_ his \_\_\_\_\_ burden.”
- e) What verse in this great chapter reads, “Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap?”
- f) Galatians 6:9 encourages us thusly, “And let us not be \_\_\_\_\_ in \_\_\_\_\_: for in due season we shall reap, \_\_\_\_\_ we faint not.”
- g) In Galatians 6:15, the inspired apostle pens, “For \_\_\_\_\_ Christ Jesus neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision, but a new creature.”

- h) In what verse of this chapter does Paul refer to Christians (i.e., the church) as being the true “the Israel of God?”

7. **Saturday** –

1) Psalm 26 – Read & Answer Below

- a) As this chapter opens (26:1), “what” does David ask the Lord to do to him?  
b) What does David ask God to do to him in Psalm 26:2?  
c) In what verse does he say, “...I have walked in Thy truth?”  
d) In what verse does he say, “I have hated the congregation of evildoers; and will not sit with the wicked?”  
e) The psalmist wanted to “publish with the voice of \_\_\_\_\_, and tell of all [God’s] wondrous \_\_\_\_\_.”  
f) He says of the bloody and wicked men, that “their \_\_\_\_\_ hand is full of bribes.”  
g) Per Psalm 26:11, what two things does the writer ask God to do for him as he walks in integrity?  
h) This chapter ends, “...in the \_\_\_\_\_ will I bless the Lord.”

- a) Please read Galatians 6:1. Is it possible for a brother to fall into sin and thus need to be restored?  
b) In what verse is the New Testament referred to as “the law of Christ?”  
c) Galatians 6:3 reads, “For if a man think himself to be something, when he is \_\_\_\_\_, he \_\_\_\_\_ himself.”  
d) In brief, please explain the meaning of Galatians 6:6.  
e) Galatians 6:10 commands, “As \_\_\_\_\_ have therefore opportunity, let us do \_\_\_\_\_ unto \_\_\_\_\_ men, especially unto them who are of the \_\_\_\_\_ of faith.”
