- d) What type of item is described in this chapter as being “in the hand of the Lord?” (a cup, vs. 8)
- e) What verse ends with the phrase, “...I will sing praises to the God of Jacob?” (Psalm 75:9)
- f) Psalm 75:10 reads, “All the horns of the _____ also will I cut off; but the horns of the _____ shall be exalted.” (wicked; righteous)

- e) Showing his trust in Divine providence, in 1 Thessalonians 3:11, Paul declares, “Now God Himself and our _____, and our Lord _____ Christ, _____ our way unto you.” (Father; Jesus; direct)
- f) In what verse does Paul say that he wants their “hearts” to be “unblameable in holiness before God...?” (1 Thessalonians 3:13)

- d) In what verse does the psalmist say, “...my spirit made diligent search?” (Psalm 77:6)
- e) Though troubled and overwhelmed, the disturbed psalmist writes, “I will _____ the works of the Lord: surely I will _____ Thy wonders of old.” (remember; remember, vs. 11)
- f) In what verse does the inspired penman write, “I will meditate also of all Thy works, and talk of Thy doings?” (Psalm 77:12)
- g) In his discouragement, in Psalm 77:9, the psalmist asked, “Hath God _____ to be gracious? Hath He in anger shut up His tender _____? Selah.” (forgotten; mercies)
- h) Describing God’s awesome power, what verse says, “...the earth trembled and shook?” (psalm 77:18)
- i) Are Aaron and Moses mentioned in this chapter? (Yes, vs. 20)

(Yes. The text is to plain to misunderstand. If it was impossible for them to fall away or give up and thus turn back to the world, then why did he send Timothy?!)
- d) The phrase, “...I sent to know your faith...” is found in what verse? (1 Thessalonians 3:5)
- e) What type of report (i.e., concerning the faith of the Thessalonians) did Timothy return to Paul and the others? (He reported that the Thessalonians were living a life of faithfulness, vs. 6-7)
- f) What reaction did Paul and the others have concerning the report that Timothy brought back? (They were thankful and joyful, vs. 9)
- g) What verse in this chapter reflects the great prayer life of Paul and his fellow workers? (1 Thessalonians 3:10)

- h) What verse in this chapter references the second coming of Jesus Christ (i.e., the Day of Judgment)? (1 Thessalonians 3:13)

 - c) Speaking of God, what verse in this chapter declares, “...how long wilt Thou be angry against the prayer of Thy people?” (Psalm 80:4)
 - d) What verse reads, “...our enemies laugh among themselves?” (Psalm 80:6)
 - e) In figurative fashion and for comparison sake, Psalm 80:8 declares, “Thou hast brought a _____ out of Egypt...” (vine)
 - f) Obviously comparing Israel to this “vine,” Psalm 80:14 states, “_____, we beseech Thee, O God of hosts: look down from heaven, and behold, and visit this _____.” (Return; vine)
 - g) What verse reads, “Turn us again, O Lord God of hosts, cause Thy face to shine; and we shall be saved?” (Psalm 80:19)
- 2) 1 Thessalonians 4 – Read & Word Study/Research
- a) What early verse in this chapter refers to the way Christians “ought to walk and to please God?” (1 Thessalonians 4:1)

- b) What verse refers to the Christian responsibility of possessing one's body or vessel "in sanctification and honour?" (1 Thessalonians 4:4)
- c) 1 Thessalonians 4:9 reminds us, "But as touching brotherly _____ ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are _____ of _____ to _____ one another." (love; taught; God; love)
- d) In 1 Thessalonians 4:10, Paul told the Thessalonians, "...but we beseech you, brethren, that ye increase more and more." What is he talking about? (He is referring to them continuing and increasing in their love for the brethren, vs. 9-10)
- e) When Paul refers to those who are "asleep," what is he referencing? (He is speaking of those who have died. The term "asleep" is a euphemism or kinder/gentler way of referring to those who previously had died, vs. 13, 15)
- f) The phrase, "...even as others which have no hope" is found in what verse? (1 Thessalonians 4:13)
- g) Does 1 Thessalonians 4:17 describe Christians living on a renewed/replenished earth? (No! The text says that we will "meet the Lord in the air.")
- h) What verse in this chapter shows that Christians (i.e., those IN the Lord) who die faithful will not need to be concerned with falling away during eternity? (1 Thessalonians 4:17 – note the phrase, "so shall we EVER be with the Lord")
- i) Is their comfort available for those who die "in" the Lord? (Absolutely, vs. 13-18)
