2. **Monday** –

1) **Psalm 111 – Read & Answer Below**

- a) The second phrase of the first verse is very powerful. It reads, “...I will praise the Lord with my _____ heart.” (whole, vs. 1)
- b) What early verse begins, “The works of the Lord are great...?” (Psalm 111:2)
- c) Has God made His “wonderful works to be remembered?” (Yes, vs. 4)
- d) Is God vindictive and hateful or is He gracious and full of compassion? (He is “gracious and full of compassion,” vs. 4)
- e) Regarding God, what verse ends by stating, “...all His commandments are sure?” (Psalm 111:7)
- f) Psalm 111:9 contains the statement, “...holy and reverend is His name.” Who does this speak of? (In context, it is clearly speaking of God. It is shameful and tragic that “men” often refer to themselves and/or others by the title of “reverend.” NO—it is God who is reverend and NOT man. The context is dealing with the respect and reverence owed to God.)
- g) Psalm 111:10 tells us that, “The fear of the _____ is the beginning of _____....” (fear; wisdom)

- a) Does Psalm 112:1 open with the same words as Psalm 111:1 and also Psalm 113:1? (Yes, “Praise ye the Lord, vs. 1)
- b) Psalm 112:1 declares, “...Blessed is the man that _____ the Lord, that delighteth greatly in His _____.” (feareth; commandments)
- c) The statement “Unto the upright there ariseth light in the darkness...,” begins what verse? (Psalm 112:4)
- d) What type of man guides his affairs with discretion? (A good man, vs. 5)
- e) Psalm 112:6 tells us that “...the _____ shall be in everlasting remembrance.” (righteous)
- f) Again showing one of the key themes of the book of Psalms (i.e., trusting in God), Psalm 112:7 refers to one whose “...heart is _____, _____ in the Lord.” (fixed; trusting)
- g) What type of person in this chapter is described as grieving, gnashing with his teeth, etc.? (The wicked, vs. 10)
- h) What late verse declares, “...the desire of the wicked shall perish?” (Psalm 112:10)

- a) Per 2 Timothy 1:1 “the promise of life” is located “___ Christ Jesus.” (in)

- b) In what verse does Paul speak of remembering Timothy in his prayers “night and day?” (2 Timothy 1:3)
- c) In what verse does Paul mention Timothy’s mother (i.e., Eunice) and grandmother (i.e., Lois)? (2 Timothy 1:5)
- d) What verse reads, “For God hath not given us the spirit of fear, but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind?” (2 Timothy 1:7)
- e) The end of what verse speaks of Christ who “...hath brought life and immortality to light through the gospel?” (2 Timothy 1:10)
- f) 2 Timothy 1:13 clearly states, “Hold fast the _____ of _____ words....” (form; sound)
- g) In 2 Timothy 1:15 does Paul call names regarding certain individuals who turned away from the truth? (Yes!)
- h) Paul mentions a brother by the name of Onesiphorus. Was this brother faithful or unfaithful? (He was faithful, vs. 16-18)

1) Psalm 113 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Psalm 113:2 says, “Blessed be the _____ of the Lord....” (name)
- b) The end of the Psalm 113:3 tells us that “the Lord’s _____ is to be praised.” (name)
- c) Psalm 113:5-6 is a powerful section of Scripture. It reads, “Who is like unto the _____ our God, who dwelleth on high, Who humbleth Himself to behold the things that are in _____, and in the _____.” (Lord; heaven; earth)
- d) Speaking of God, what verse begins “He raiseth up the poor out of the dust...?” (Psalm 113:7)
- e) Again speaking of God, what verse begins, “He maketh the barren woman to keep house, and to be a joyful mother of children...?” (Psalm 113:9)
- f) What is the first phrase of this chapter? (Praise ye the Lord, vs. 1)
- g) What is the last phrase of this chapter? (Praise ye the Lord, vs. 9)

2) 2 Timothy 1 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) Was the apostle Paul a man of prayer? (Yes, vs. 3-4)
- b) 2 Timothy 1:5 mentions the phrase “unfeigned faith.” What does this phrase mean? (The term “feigned” means pretended. Hence, “un”-“feigned” refers to that which is not pretended. In other words, it references that which is NOT FAKE. Thus, it refers to that which is genuine. Paul is referencing the fact that Timothy’s faith (like that of his grandmother and mother) was a genuine faith and in no way was it pretended or fake.)
- c) Referencing Timothy’s ability to work miracles based on the apostle Paul’s power of transference (cf., Acts 8:18), 2 Timothy 1:6 records Paul thusly, “Wherefore I put thee in remembrance that thou _____ the _____ of God, which is in thee _____ the putting on of _____.” (stir; up; gift; by; my; hands)
- d) 2 Timothy 1:9 reads, “Who hath _____ us, and _____ us, with an holy calling, not according to our works, but according to his own _____ and grace, which was given us _____ Christ Jesus before the world began.” (saved; called; purpose; in)
- e) Was Paul’s primary work as an apostle of Christ among the Jews or among the Gentiles? (The Gentiles, vs. 11)

- f) 2 Timothy 1:12 is a powerful and wonderful verse. It shows the assurance faithful Christians should feel based on evidence. It reads, "...nevertheless I am not ashamed: for I _____ whom I have believed, and am _____ that He is _____ that which I have committed unto Him against that day." (know; persuaded; able; to; keep)
- g) What are the names of the two individuals that Paul marks by name—as being those who “turned away?” (Phygellus and Hermogenes, vs. 15)
- h) In contrast to the above two false men, what faithful brother does Paul specifically mention in this chapter? (Onesiphorus, vs. 16)
- i) Was the good influence of “Onesiphorus” well-known by Timothy? (Yes, vs. 18)

- f) An obvious key verse in this chapter is Psalm 114:7. It reads, “_____, thou _____, at the presence of the _____, at the presence of the God of _____.” (Tremble; earth; Lord; Jacob)

- j) Is the Devil mentioned specifically in this chapter? (Yes, vs. 26)

- a) What are the first four words of this chapter? (I love the Lord, vs. 1)
- b) When the psalmist found himself in “trouble and sorrow,” what did he do? (He prayed (i.e., “Then called I upon the name of the Lord...”), vs. 4)
- c) What early verse reads, “Gracious is the Lord, and righteous; yea, our God is merciful?” (Psalm 116:5)
- d) Psalm 116:9 should be the theme of everyone’s life, namely, “I will walk before the _____ in the land of the living.” (Lord)
- e) Psalm 116:10 begins, “I _____, therefore have I _____....” (believed; spoken)
- f) What verse contains the question, “What shall I render unto the Lord for all His benefits toward me?” (Psalm 116:12)
- g) What verse contains the famous passage, “Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints?” (Psalm 116:15)

- d) Was Jesus Christ from the seed of David or was He from the seed of Saul? (of David, vs. 8)
- e) In what verse does Paul (a prisoner for the cause of Christ) tell us that “the word of God is not bound?” (2 Timothy 2:9)

- f) What verse begins, “Of these things put them in remembrance...?” (2 Timothy 2:14)
- g) What verse begins, “Who concerning the truth have erred...?” (2 Timothy 2:18)
- h) What verse ends referencing teachings which “...overthrow the faith of some?” (2 Timothy 2:18)
- i) What verse ends, “...And, Let every one that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity?” (2 Timothy 2:19)
- j) Briefly explain 2 Timothy 2:24-26. (Teachers/Christians should not look for a fight. Rather, they should kindly and with concern seek to turn the lost to Christ. This requires gentleness and patience. After all, the lost are opposed to themselves being ensnared by the devil. It is our job to teach them God’s truth so that they will have the opportunity to leave the ways of evil and come to repentance. Like God, we want them to leave error and come to the truth. Notice the first part of vs. 26 – “And that THEY may recover themselves out of the snare of the devil...” Yes, it is THEIR CHOICE, but it is OUR OBLIGATION to teach them and help them by spreading the gospel message!)
