2. **Monday** –

1) Job 39 – Read & Answer Below

- a) As this chapter opens, who is speaking? (God is still speaking)
- b) As this chapter opens, who is being spoken to? (Job)
- c) In this chapter does God speak of His control over various animals or does He speak of His control over heathen nations? (He speaks concerning various animals and the fact that He (God) is in control, vs. 1ff)
- d) What is the first animal that God speaks of? (Wild goats, vs. 1)
- e) In what verse does God begin to speak of the unicorn (i.e., wild bull)? (Job 39:9)
- f) What animal is God using in His speech to Job, when He says that she “leaveth her eggs in the earth, and warmeth them in dust?” (The ostrich, vs. 13-14)
- g) In what verse does God begin to speak of the horse? (Job 39:19)
- h) What great animal is under discussion as described thusly, “He mocketh at fear, and is not affrighted...?” (The horse, 19, 22)
- i) In what verse does God ask Job, “Doth the hawk fly by THY wisdom...?” (Job 39:26)

1) Job 40 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Job 40:1 says, “Moreover the _____ answered _____, and said.” (Lord; Job)
- b) Job 40:2 continues, “Shall he that _____ with the _____ instruct Him? He that _____ God, let him _____ it.” (contendeth; Almighty; reproveth; answer)
- c) Job 40:3 reads, “Then _____ answered the Lord, and said.” (Job)
- d) Did Job re-think his position regarding wanting to question God? (Yes, vs. 4-5)
- e) What verse says, “Then answered the Lord unto Job out of the whirlwind, and said?” (Job 40:6)
- f) After showing His ultimate power as opposed to Job’s (i.e., and/or any other man’s), in what verse does God say, “Then will I also confess unto thee that thine own right hand can save thee?” (Job 40:14. In other words, God is telling Job, “Job you do this and that and THEN I’ll admit you are able to save yourself. Obviously the point is this: Job was not able to do this or that, hence he could not save himself. God is in control—not man!)
- g) Job 40:15 describes an incredible creature (i.e., dinosaur). What is this creature’s name? (Behemoth)

- h) Does God say clearly that He made the Behemoth “with thee” (i.e., with man)? (Yes, vs. 15! As Genesis clearly shows God made everything in six days.)
 - i) What verse says, “He moveth his tail like a cedar (i.e., a tree)?” (Job 40:17)
 - j) Job 40:19 declares of this Behemoth, “He is the _____ of the ways of God.” (chief)
 - k) What verse says of this magnificent creature, “...his nose pierceth through snares?” (Job 40:24)
- 2) 2 Corinthians 10 – Read & Answer Below
- a) In defense of his apostleship, Paul begins this chapter, speaking to the Corinthians Christians thusly, “Now I _____ myself beseech you by the _____ and _____ of Christ....” (Paul; meekness; gentleness, vs.1)
 - b) 2 Corinthians 10:4 reads, “For the _____ or our _____ are not _____, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds.” (weapons; warfare; carnal)
 - c) 2 Corinthians 10:5 continues, “Casting down _____, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the _____ of God, and bringing into _____ every _____ to the _____ of Christ.” (imagination; knowledge; captivity; thought; obedience)
 - d) Referencing what his enemies “were saying,” in verse does Paul declare, “For his letters, say they, are weighty and powerful; but his bodily presence is weak, and his speech contemptible?” (2 Corinthians 10:10)
 - e) Speaking of his inspired letters, as opposed to being personally present with the Corinthians (as a true apostle), in what specific verse does Paul tell the Corinthians, “...such as we are in word by letters when we are absent, such will we be in deed when we are present?” (2 Corinthians 10:11)
 - f) In what verse does the inspired apostle Paul say of his false accusers/enemies, “...but they measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise?” (2 Corinthians 10:12)
 - g) 2 Corinthians 10:18 states, “For _____ he that commendeth himself is _____, but whom the _____ commendeth.” (not; approved; Lord)

4. Wednesday –

- 1) Job 41 – Read & Answer Below
- a) As this chapter opens, who is still speaking? (God is speaking to Job, cf. 40:6ff)
 - b) As this chapter opens, what is the name of the creature (i.e., dinosaur) that God speaks of? (Leviathan, vs. 1)
 - c) In Job 41:1, God asks Job, “Canst thou draw out _____ with an hook?” (Leviathan)
 - d) Referencing His magnificent and powerful creature—the Leviathan, in what verse does God ask Job, “Wilt thou play with him as with a bird?” (Job 41:5)
 - e) In what verse does God ask, “...shall not one be cast down even at the sight of him?” (Job 41:9)
 - f) Comparing the dinosaur/creature, in Job 41:10, God says, “None is fierce that dare stir him up: who then is able to _____ before Me?” (stand)
 - g) In what verse does God say that Leviathan’s “teeth are terrible round about?” (Job 41:14)

- h) Job 41:25, still regarding the magnificent Leviathan, says, “When he _____ up himself, the _____ are afraid....” (raiseth; mighty)
 - i) Was the Leviathan afraid of arrows? What about spears? Was the Leviathan afraid of spears? (No, vs. 28-29)
 - j) Referencing the Leviathan, what verse tells us, “Upon earth there is not his like...?” (Job 41:33)
- 2) 2 Corinthians 10 – Read & Word Study/Research
- a) In what verse does Paul reference some (i.e., the enemies of his apostleship/false accusers) “which think of us as if we walked according to the flesh?” (2 Corinthians 10:2)
 - b) Does Paul compare Christianity to spiritual warfare in 2 Corinthians 10:3-5? (Yes!)
 - c) In what verse does Paul ask the Corinthians brethren, “Do ye look on things after the outward appearance...?” (2 Corinthians 10:7)
 - d) In what verse does Paul reference “our authority” as it pertains to apostolic power? (2 Corinthians 10:8)
 - e) According to this chapter, did God give the apostles (i.e., like Paul) authority/power for their use in edification or destruction? (edification, vs. 8)
 - f) The first three words of 2 Corinthians 10:10 are, “For his letters.” The next two words show context. What are these next two words? (“say they” This shows that Paul is defending himself against what SOME others are wrongly saying against him and his apostleship. They were saying that he was strong in letters only, but he would be weak and timid if he were to physically come to the Corinthians. Paul assures them that such was not the case, but rather it was BECAUSE he wanted to gently bear with them that he refrained from coming to them in person. Such will be made clear as the letter continues.)
 - g) Can a person’s faith be increased? What verse in this chapter contains the phrase “when your faith is increased?” (Yes. The Bible references those of “little faith, great faith,” etc. Cf. vs. 15)
 - h) What verse begins, “To preach the gospel in the regions beyond you...?” (2 Corinthians 10:16)
 - i) 2 Corinthians 10:17 reads, “But he that _____, let him _____ in the _____.” (glorith; glory; Lord)

5. **Thursday** –

- 1) Job 42 – Read & Answer Below
- a) As this chapter begins, who is speaking? (Job speaks, vs. 1-6. After this God speaks to Eliphaz, vs. 7-8. Then the text gives a narrative on how God blessed Job, etc.)
 - b) In Job 42:3, Job confesses to God, “...I uttered that I understood ____; things too wonderful for me, which I knew ____.” (not; not)
 - c) Job has seen the absolute greatness and majesty of God through God’s questions. In what verse does Job say of himself, “Wherefore I abhor myself, and repent in dust and ashes?” (Job 42:6)
 - d) Did God “overlook” the lies and false accusations that Job’s three “friends” had made against God and Job? (Not at all, vs. 7-10)
 - e) What person did God tell “the three friends” to seek out so that he would pray for them? (Job. God told them to have Job pray for them, vs. 8)

- f) What verse declares, "...also the Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before?" (Job 42:10)
- g) Job 42:12 begins, "So the _____ blessed the latter end of _____ more than his beginning...." (Lord; Job)
- h) Job 42:17 ends the book, "So _____ died, being old and _____ of days." (Job; full)

1) Psalm 1 – Read & Answer Below

- a) What specific verse in this short chapter mentions one who "walketh...standeth...nor sitteth...?" (Psalm 1:1)
- b) Speaking of the godly man, Psalm 1:2 reads, "...his delight is in the _____ of the Lord; and in His _____ doth he _____ day and night." (law; law; meditate)
- c) What verse clearly teaches that the godly/righteous will "meditate" upon God's Word? (Psalm 1:2)
- d) The inspired Psalmist tells us that the godly person is like a _____ "planted by the rivers of water." (tree, vs. 3)
- e) Unlike the secure and blessed way of the righteous, the first phrase of Psalm 1:4 states, "The _____ are not so." (ungodly)
- f) In what verse are the ungodly likened unto "chaff" that "the wind driveth away?" (Psalm 1:4)
- g) What verse in this Psalm reads, "For the Lord knoweth the way of the righteous: but the way of the ungodly shall perish?" (Psalm 1:6)

- a) In 2 Corinthians 11:2, Paul says, "...for I have espoused you to _____ husband, that I may present you as a _____ virgin to _____." (one; chaste; Christ)
- b) In 2 Corinthians 11:3, Paul continues, "But I _____, lest by any means, as the _____ beguiled _____ through his subtilty, so your _____ should be corrupted from the _____ that is in Christ." (fear; serpent; Eve; minds; simplicity)
- c) Speaking of financial support, in what verse does Paul affirm, "I robbed other churches, taking wages of them, to do you service?" (2 Corinthians 11:8. It should be obvious, but just in case, it should be noted that Paul is not talking about committing a crime (i.e., robbery), but instead he is speaking of "who" supported him in the preaching of the gospel.)
- d) In what verse does Paul state, "...for that which was lacking to me the brethren which came from Macedonia supplied?" (2 Corinthians 11:9)
- e) Discussing those who claimed to be apostles but were not, what verse in this chapter reads, "For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ?" (2 Corinthians 11:13)
- f) 2 Corinthians 11:14 tells us that _____ "himself is transformed into an angel of light." (Satan)
- g) What verse declares, "Of the Jews five times received I forty stripes save one?" (2 Corinthians 11:24)

- h) In 2 Corinthians 11:25, Paul continues, “Thrice was I _____ with rods, _____ was I stoned, _____ I suffered shipwreck, a night and a day I have been in the _____.” (beaten; once; thrice; deep)
- i) Referencing a time of former persecution, Paul says, “And through a _____ in a _____ was I let down by the wall, and escaped his hands.” (window; basket, vs. 33)

1) Psalm 2 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Psalm 2:2 sets the stage by telling us, “The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the _____, and against his _____, saying.” (Lord; anointed)
- b) In prophetic fashion, in what verse does the Lord say, “Yet have I set My King upon My holy hill of Zion?” (Psalm 2:6)
- c) Again, in prophetic fashion, Psalm 2:7 states, “I will declare the decree: the Lord hath said unto Me, Thou art My _____; this day have I _____ Thee.” (Son; begotten)
- d) What verse in this chapter begins, “Ask of Me, and I shall give Thee the heathen for Thine inheritance...?” (Psalm 2:8. Note, this is referencing the Gentiles. Christ would usher in salvation to both Jew and Gentiles!)
- e) What verse says, “Serve the Lord with fear, and rejoice with trembling?” (Psalm 2:11)
- f) What verse begins with the phrase, “Kiss the Son...?” (Psalm 2:12)
- g) What verse contains the phrase, “...Blessed are all they that put their trust in Him?” (Psalm 2:12)

2) 2 Corinthians 11 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) In what verse does the apostle Paul speak about “the simplicity that is in Christ?” (2 Corinthians 11:3)
- b) In what verse does he speak of one coming that might preach “another Jesus” or “another gospel?” (2 Corinthians 11:4)
- c) Speaking of either the other genuine apostles, or else being sarcastic and speaking of the false apostles, in what verse does Paul say, “For I suppose I was not a whit behind the very chiefest apostles?” (2 Corinthians 11:5)
- d) In what verse did Paul say, “...and in all things I have kept myself from being burdensome unto you, and so will I keep myself?” (2 Corinthians 11:9)
- e) What section of this chapter references “false apostles” and also false “ministers” who present themselves as “ministers of righteousness” even though they are actually teaching falsehoods? (2 Corinthians 11:13-15)
- f) In 2 Corinthians 11:22, Paul continues to present his case regarding him being a true apostle as opposed to the false apostles that had stirred up much trouble. In this verse he says, “Are _____ Hebrews? So am _____. Are _____ Israelites? So am _____. Are _____ the seed of Abraham? So am _____.” (they; I; they; I; they; I)
- g) In what verse does Paul speak of “perils...among false brethren?” (2 Corinthians 11:26)
- h) “Beside those things that are without,” what came upon Paul “daily?” (The care/concern of all the churches, vs. 28)
- i) Paul spoke of God knowing that he/Paul was not lying? What verse is this thought found in? (2 Corinthians 11:31)
